HOUSTON, TEXAS — **FEBRUARY 22, 2024** — Artistic Directors Julie Kent and Stanton Welch AM proudly unveil the 2024 – 2025 season with three mixed repertory programs along with three story ballets. This upcoming season continues to exemplify why Houston Ballet is a top-tier dance company and a hub for world-renowned artists setting the stage for Houston as a mecca for global talent.

"The incredible range of ballets offers growth for our dancers as well as audiences," says Artistic Director Julie Kent. "From curtain up to curtain down, this season explores the depth and breadth of this art form, and I'm so excited to be involved in presenting works we've never seen before and the kind of classics that are a wonderful way to introduce new audiences to ballet."

Among the season's one-act highlights are Stanton Welch's *Velocity* and *Maninyas*, George Balanchine's *Theme and Variations*, Ben Stevenson's *Four Last Songs*, Aszure Barton's *Come In* and Lila York's *Celts*, and so much more! Audiences will also see new works created on the company by sought-after choreographers such as Silas Farley and Brett Ishida.

The three story ballets headlining this season include John Neumeier's Houston premiere of *The Little Mermaid*, Ben Stevenson's *The Sleeping Beauty*, and Stanton Welch's world premiere of *Raymonda* adding his eighth full-length ballet created on the Company to Houston Ballet's repertory.

Audiences will also delight in seasonal favorites such as Stanton Welch's *The Nutcracker* and the exclusive, one-night-only performance of the Margaret Alkek Williams Jubilee of Dance, and Houston Ballet Academy Spring Showcase.

ABOUT HOUSTON BALLET

With over 50 years of rich history, Houston Ballet has evolved into a company with a budget of \$37.6 million and an endowment of \$97.5 million (as of June 2023), making it the country's fourth-largest ballet company. Its \$46.6 million state-of-the-art performance space, the Houston Ballet Margaret Alkek Williams Center for Dance opened in April 2011. In addition, Houston Ballet's reach is global, touring in renowned theaters in Dubai, London, Paris, Moscow, Spain, Montréal, Ottawa, Melbourne, New York City, Washington, D.C., Los Angeles, Tokyo and more.

Australian choreographer Stanton Welch AM has served as Artistic Director of Houston Ballet since 2003. Welch has choreographed 43 new works for Houston Ballet during his tenure while ensuring the growth of the Company's repertoire by presenting works from George Balanchine, William Forsythe, Jiří Kylián, Sir Kenneth MacMillan, John Neumeier, and Jerome Robbins. Welch continues the legacy of Houston Ballet being a choreographic Eden by commissioning over 30 works from world-renowned choreographers including Aszure Barton, Trey McIntyre, Annabelle Lopez Ochoa and Justin Peck. Julie Kent joined Welch as Artistic Director in 2023, after serving as Artistic Director of The Washington Ballet from 2016 – 2023 and following a storied career as a Principal ballerina of American Ballet Theatre- the longest-tenured dancer in ABT's 85-year history. Executive Director James Nelson serves as the administrative leader of the organization, a position he assumed in February 2012 after serving as the Company's General Manager for more than a decade.

Beyond its stage presence, Houston Ballet maintains a strong foothold in continuing to foster a love for dance in future generations. Its Education and Community Engagement program reaches more than 85,000 individuals in the Houston area annually. Houston Ballet Academy trains more than 1,000 students every year, producing more than 60 percent of the extraordinary artists that comprise Houston Ballet's current Company.
